

Northwest Wildlife Preservation Society (NWPS) is a non-profit registered charity focused on preservation through education. The Society is seeking to fill the position of Wildlife Educator to deliver programs on behalf of the organization. The role includes program delivery, fundraising and administration duties. This position reports to the Wildlife Education Manager and ultimately to the Executive Director. The successful applicant will be an independent self-starter, someone who is very knowledgeable and passionate about wildlife and conservation, and an individual who is committed, mature and resourceful.

Job Title: Wildlife Educator

Job Duties:

The Wildlife Educator is responsible for the education component of the Society. Main responsibilities include:

1. Deliver environmental education programs to K to 12 schoolchildren, adults and special interest groups
2. Represent NWPS at community events
3. Generate revenue through grant applications, honorariums, and other campaigns.
4. Content creation for communications
5. Administrative duties such reporting, scheduling and volunteer coordination

This position requires regular travel within the Greater Vancouver Regional District. Driver's license and daily access to a vehicle is required.

Qualifications: Applicants must have a university degree in Environmental Science or Biology and minimum 2 years experience delivering programs/presentations to a live audience.
